ITEM 1. Rescind 801—Chapter 2 and adopt the following **new** chapter in lieu thereof:

CHAPTER 2 PETITIONS FOR RULEMAKING

The commission adopts, with the following exceptions and amendments, the Uniform Rules on Agency Procedure related to petitions for rulemaking, which are published at www.legis.iowa.gov/docs/Rules/Current/UniformRules.pdf on the Iowa general assembly's website. References to "the agency" within any uniform rule include the department or the commission, as applicable.

801—2.1(17A) Petition for rulemaking. In lieu of the words "(designate office)", insert "the office of the commandant. This office is located at Camp Dodge, Building 3465, 7105 NW 70th Avenue, Johnston, Iowa 50131-1824". In lieu of the words "(agency name)", insert either "Iowa commission of veterans affairs" or "Iowa department of veterans affairs", as applicable. At the end of this rule, insert "The executive director shall notify the chairperson of the commission that the petition has been filed."
